Dr. Woodrum taught at WVU for 21 years and was a Professor in Special Education and Educational Psychology. During that period of time, she also served as an adjunct professor in the WVU School of Medicine- Department of Pediatrics where

she worked in the Myelodysplasia Clinic and with the University Affiliated Center for Developmental Disabilities.

In 1983, Dr. Woodrum completed her work in school psychology, served an internship in Taylor County Public Schools and became a licensed school psychologist specializing in children of all ages well into adulthood. Areas of expertise include learning disabilities, intellectually disabled, behaviorally and emotionally disturbed, gifted, ADHD and individuals on the spectrum.

Dr. Woodrum has been a presenter at multiple national conferences in School Psychology and Special Education; authored many articles and contributed chapters to text books.

Since joining Fremouw, Sigley and Baker, Dr. Woodrum has been involved in the evaluation of college aged students in many colleges and universities in West Virginia, Pennsylvania, and Maryland. She is currently working with the WVU Department of Athletics across all sport areas.

Dr. Woodrum is also involved with evaluations related to Court Ordered Evaluations for juveniles and referrals from DHHR. She has worked with The WV Department of Rehabilitative Services providing services where needed in their various offices throughout West Virginia. She is providing evaluations for The Waiver Programs for Emotionally Disturbed Children as well as the Intellectually Disabled.

Dr. Woodrum has acted as a supervisor during internships needed by school psychologists, and psychologists and does yearly portfolio reviews for the National Association of School Psychologists.
